Informal

Noun:

1. **a.** A seasonally flooded bottomland with more woody plants than a marsh and better drainage than a bog.

b. A lowland region saturated with water.

2. A situation or place fraught with difficulties and imponderables: *a financial swamp*.

v. swamped, swamp-ing, swamps

v.tr.

1. To drench in or cover with or as if with water.

2. To inundate or burden; overwhelm: *She was swamped with work.*

3. *Nautical* To fill (a ship or boat) with water to the point of sinking it.

v.intr.

To become full of water or sink.
